Answer: Per Bylaws Page 67. A. All resignations of Officers should be in writing and sent to the President and Secretary of the body from which the Officer is resigning. 1. If the Secretary is resigning, the resignation shall be sent to the President of the body from which they are resigning. 2. Resignations are effective when issued. 3. Verbal resignations are binding.

I've been asked by Auxiliary members for ideas of organizations to partner with under the Auxiliary Outreach Program. There are many ways to grow your network of organizations outside of the VFW Post and Auxiliary:

Check local community activities on the internet ("Google it") to see what is happening in your local area.

- \* Homeless shelters, soup kitchens and food banks/pantries

  \* Local Police, Fire Departments and EMT Services
- \* Schools and libraries to help with reading/tutoring programs
  - \* Youth organizations
    - \* Senior Centers
  - \* Community Parks and Recreation Departments
- \* Habitat for Humanity and other community family projects

You can also go to <a href="www.volunteermatch.org">www.volunteermatch.org</a> – you merely enter your zip code and fill in your Auxiliary members interests to receive a list of places in your area to reach out to. This is a wonderful resource. Another way to promote the availability of volunteers from the Auxiliary is to make and distribute flyers in public community areas. This gives an opportunity for you to reach organizations you may not think of. Be sure to include a contact person and number.

Don't forget to have the project pre-approved at an Auxiliary meeting and have it recorded in the minutes. On rare occasions (i.e., a natural disaster or emergency community need) the project can be voted upon after the fact. When reporting include the number of members volunteering, the hours involved, and the miles driven to assist another organization.

To let it be known that you are a VFW Auxiliary member (& to get Auxiliary Outreach credit), wear an Auxiliary item. This can be a shirt, hat, jacket or a name tag. Be proud to wear these items and smile! Volunteering can be done as an individual or as a group.

Promote your Auxiliary Outreach activities on your social media page. Pictures say so much about how members serve their neighbors and other community organizations. Be sure to include the hashtag #Auxiliaryoutreach on your post.

This program is about partnering with another organization. It does not include donations of good and/or money to help the organization.

Birthdays are important to everyone, especially someone who is in the hospital. This is why we are going to continue sending birthday cards to the veterans who are at the State Veterans Home and the Community Living Center at the Hot Springs VA. All the Auxiliaries should think about sending cards or going to visit any veterans that might be in their local hospitals, assisted living, or nursing homes. This would make them feel good.

I would like to start another project that would involve the elderly and the youth. It is great to receive cards on your birthday, but what about just on a normal day. My thought is to have each Auxiliary contact their Elementary School in their area and see if the teachers would be willing to have their students draw or color pictures, make cards, or make a craft that we could send to the State Veterans Home and the Community Living Center each month. I suggest that we spread it out over time so the whole elementary is not sending everything at once. Have each elementary class takes a month and do some projects that would be sent. Then next month it would be a different class. Example is 5<sup>th</sup> grade would do October, then 4<sup>th</sup> grade would do November, and so on. When the homes receive the envelope of pictures and cards, they could distribute them out to the veterans or hang them up so all can see. I think this would brighten the veteran's normal day.

I am still new at being the chairman of the Hospital committee and am always willing to hear new ideas. Please let me know if there is something you do in your own communities that might be good for all of the Auxiliaries to think about.

# **PROGRAM GOALS**

VFW Priority Goals and Action Corps Weekly Be an Advocate, Be Informed and Be Engaged

We should pay particular attention to Senate Bill 2061, the Molly R Loomis Research for Descendants of Toxic Exposed Veterans Act. This Bill would amend the PACT Act to require the Interagency Working Group on Toxic Exposure to expand its research focus to include the diagnosis and treatment of health conditions in descendants of veterans exposed to toxic substances during military service.

Without government leadership, research remains fragmented, underfunded, and inconclusive, leaving veterans' families to struggle without clear guidance or accountability.

Contact our National Senators and Representative and urge them to support this Bill.
