 A day for Americans to remember and honor service members who have been injured or killed in action while serving in the US Armed Forces. Info to Share: https://www.military.com/coast-guard

- The Coast Guard falls under the U.S.
 Department of Homeland Security during peacetime
- Considered a military service because during times of war/conflict, the President may transfer this group to the Department of the Navy
- the Coast Guard has approximately 43,000 active-duty men and women, more than 8,000 Reservists and 30,000 Auxiliary personnel
- On call 365 days a year to protect the waterways and people of the U.S.A.
- Motto: "Semper Paratus"—Always Ready



PURPLE HEART---Did you know?

- Oldest military award still presented to military service members
- Given to US service members of any rank who have been wounded or killed in action while serving in the US Armed Forces
- in 1782 that General George Washington, Commander-In-Chief of the Continental Army, commissioned the first Purple Heart Medal, initially called the Badge of Military Merit.
- To date--John F. Kennedy, is the only President with a Purple Heart

Americanism goals and Back to School are GREAT together!

Ideas:

- Adopt a teacher and his/her class for the school year. Use your imagination by creating a start-up basket using red/white/blue as your theme. Check the VFW Store for items such as patriotic pencils and rulers to add to it. Perhaps a sweet treat could be added too. You might include a list of special patriotic holidays that occur in August and September with information for the teacher to share. Present on the first day of school! Then throughout the year provide patriotic information to the teacher. Plan activities to bring Americanism to the class throughout the year: always gaining permission from the teacher first.
- Arrange with the VFW of your community, your auxiliary, and the school system a special activity for the first day of school. Here are a few suggestions:
 - You could provide patriotic popsicles to be given to the students.
 - Activity: Elementary --Have VFW and Auxiliary members line the sidewalks leading into the school waving American flags and some with Welcome Back signs. Cheering the kids on to a great year.
 - Attach a flag to a red pen or pencil along with a food treat to be given to each teacher on the first day.
