September 11th

Patriot Day- on September 11th every year will be a day of honor and remembrance for those that were killed by terrorist attacks at the World Trade Center in New York City, the Pentagon in Virginia, and those who perished when the hijacked United Airlines Flight 93 crashed in Pennsylvania on 9/11/2001. Ways to tribute the heroes and victims who lost their lives.

- U.S. flags flown at half-staff.
- a moment of silence beginning at 8:46 am, Eastern Standard Time, the time that the first airplane struck the World Trade Center
- to teach the young about 9/11
- ceremonies of remembrance and candlelight vigils

Constitution Day— September 17th every year commemorates the creation and signing of the U.S. Constitution

- On 9/17/1787 at the U.S. Constitutional Convention in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania the Constitution was signed by 39 delegates.
- Document established
 - the framework of our government
 - rights and freedoms that 'We the People' have today
- Name Changes by Congress
 - 'I am an America' -3rd Sunday in May set in 1940
 - Citizenship Day moved to September 17th (in 1952)
 - Constitution Day & Citizenship Day- September 17th (renamed in 2004)
- Since 2004 Congress mandated that all public schools and government offices must promote constitutional literacy on this day. <u>Ideas:</u>
 - special programs and discussions about the Constitution's history and relevance
 - Reciting the Preamble to the U.S. Constitution in unison

POW-Prisoners of War MIA-Missing in Action

On this day of recognition, we honor the commitments and the sacrifices every prisoner of war has made and those still missing in action. It is specified by law that the black POW/MIA flag be flown on this date and five others over federal facilities and cemeteries, post offices, and military installations.

 One way to honor these veterans and educate others is by a having the Missing Man Table Ceremony. Place in a prominent location in your community where many may view it. There is a <u>Missing Man Table</u> <u>Ceremony</u> located on the SD VFW auxiliary website under the Americanism program or in MALTA.

Gold Star Mother's/Family Day---Last Sunday in September

This year September 29, 2024 is Gold Star Mother's/Family Day for people to recognize and honor mothers and families who have lost a military service member while serving the United States Armed Forces in the line of duty or in support of military actions.
