A Military Tradition

Traditions only continue if people understand the what, why, and when. Thus, instructing others of the Star Family Recognition military tradition is goal of the Americanism program. Learn the facts, share them, and then make sure anyone that qualifies is presented the appropriate Star flag to display.

STAR Family Recognition:

- Military tradition using official service flags/banners with a blue, silver, or gold star that pays tribute to military family members whose loved ones are: on active duty or were wounded or killed in action.
- A service flag approved by the Secretary of Defense may be displayed in a window of the place
 of residence of individuals who are members of the immediate family of an individual serving in
 the Armed Forces of the United States during any period of war or hostilities in which the Armed
 Forces of the United States are engaged.



- The blue star, symbolizing hope and pride, on a white field with a red border, shall signify
 that one or more family members are currently serving in the armed forces during war or
 hostilities.
- The display of the blue star service flag shows a family's pride in their loved one(s) serving in the military and the hope for their safe return home.
- What are Blue Star Families?
 The families of those protecting America are the Blue Star families. They deserve the nation's respect and admiration.



- The silver star, symbolizing gallantry, is reserved for those who have been wounded or contracted a serious illness or injury in a war zone.
- Unlike the other two service flags, the Silver Star Service Flag may be flown by anyone, not just a family member, during war or peace time.
- The silver star is a symbol of military members who have incurred serious injury which prevents them from continuing service.
- What are Silver Star Families?

The families of injured military service members are said to be, "Silver Star Families."



- The gold star honors the individual who has been killed in action or has died while on active duty...someone who made the supreme sacrifice for his/her country.
- The death does not have to be combat-related --The military service person must have died while in active service.
- Changing a Blue Star to a Gold Star occurs when a service member has died in service, the
 family replaces the blue star with a gold star. The gold star lets the community know that
 their service member died or was killed while serving their country.
- What is a Gold Star Family?

A family that has a military service person that has given the ultimate sacrifice-his/her life.
